A word from our CEO

Once again we have been astounded by the generosity of our supporters this Christmas time, with a wealth of gifts, food, toiletries, gift cards and monetary donations allowing us to provide additional support to the women, young people and children who turn to us in need. Christmas can be a difficult time for families, with the cost weighing heavily on their minds; however when you have fled to refuge and your extended family and friends are not with you it can make this time of year even harder. Therefore the joy that your support brings is just wonderful and we send our sincere thanks to you all.

We do however start 2024 in the knowledge that funding for charities across the board is becoming more difficult to acquire, this is partly because of cuts to statutory budgets as well as the pressure of applications on private Trusts and Foundations.

Core costs take the brunt of this issue, as this is sometimes overlooked as in integral part of a charities requirements; though without a building that is heated, lit and has all the regulatory requirements fulfilled we would be unable to deliver any advice/crisis appointments, or our therapeutic courses from our Women's Centre for women, young people and children that so desperately need it. In 2023 we supported just over 1,000 women and their children via our Women's Centre and finding funding to support this work is upper most in our minds as we begin 2024.

Despite these struggles we are continually grateful for the generosity of our local community and beyond for the support they provide. We are thankful for the businesses that choose Lighthouse as their Charity of the Year or for longer term support as this allows us to plan ahead with the knowledge of upcoming funds. Women's Centre Update - By Jo Bigger, Service Manager

As we move into 2024 we are finding that more women contacting our Women's Centre are presenting as high risk. This means that the women are at more risk of serious harm or death and it is vital that they are seen by our advice team as soon as possible. The Advice Worker will discuss the woman's situation with her and complete a D.A.S.H. Risk Assessment (Domestic Abuse, Stalking and Harassment and Honour Based Violence) to ascertain the clients current level of risk. Once this is complete, if the risk assessment reaches the correct threshold we can then refer the client to M.A.R.A.C. (Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conference) where the client will be assigned an IDVA (Independent Domestic Violence Advisor) to support them to bring their risk down. This service is funded by the Police & Crime Commissioner. It is extremely important that these clients have a first point of contact like Lighthouse to support them through this process and ensure that they get the help they need.

Our Community Worker has been busy assisting with a White Ribbon event that was held at The Hold, with other partner agencies and charities. The event had speakers on subjects such as Domestic Abuse Awareness, Honour Based Abuse as well as survivor's stories. Other events

attended were the Future Female Society, Be Well bus, talking to attendees about the work Lighthouse carries out.



Our Families & Children's Worker is very busy supporting the children of the women accessing our service. Children and young people are hugely impacted by domestic abuse in a variety of ways and Amy works in groups, with mum and children in the Re-connect and Play/Together sessions and also provides one to one sessions with the children/young people if they have a specific concern they would like to work on.

Refuge Update - By Jo Bigger, Service Manager

Christmas was a lovely affair in Refuge and this was massively supported by the wonderful donations that we received from the local community. We had a range of activities going on including a Christmas party with Mrs Christmas popping along to say hello.

Life is very demanding at the refuge with occupancy being high and when women and families are ready to move on, their rooms need to be turned around quickly by our

Housekeeper ready for the next woman or family to move in. The welfare team who support the women are often dealing with some very complex support needs as they have in the past supported women around their immigration status and social care involvement with their children. Including the support provided by the refuge Welfare Workers, the women can also access counselling



sessions, attend The Freedom Programme and our Power To Change programmes. All of which go towards helping the women start to recover from what has happened to them.

The Children's Support Workers work very closely with mum and schools to ensure that they get a place in nursery or school as soon as possible after moving into refuge. This is vital to ensure the children's education is disrupted as little as possible and to give them some sense of normality back into their lives. The children also enjoy lots of activities with the workers with Mum & Me sessions and interactive story time, which recently was Peppa Pig at Christmas as well as activities for the older children.

Hello, I'm Kirsty and I have the pleasure of working as part of the Children's Services Team. I am based at our refuge and spend lots of time with the children.

Part of my role as Children's Support Worker is planning and running activities for the children who live in the house. I have worked with people of all ages and abilities, previously running a craft studio and working within schools. I understand the importance of providing an all inclusive environment and making a difference to the people I work with. My role at the refuge can vary day to day; a big part of my role is securing a school/nursery placement for the child to ensure they continue their education.





We are very lucky to have a large outdoor space along with a wonderful playroom and I utilise these amazing spaces when organising activities. I love to craft, so enjoy getting everyone together to use their creative skills, from painting, to modelling and more. We have lots of fun and get to experience new activities together. During this time I work closely with the children getting to know their likes/ dislikes and needs. The Children Services Team provides support to children at a very unsettled time in their life, and pride themselves in supporting families throughout their stay with us.

In conjunction with Wots Up, we hosted a Christmas party for the families of the house during the festive period. We had a bouncy castle, party food, played party games and also had a visit from Mother Christmas.





Whilst working at the refuge for over a year, I have seen first hand the difference our support has made to the families. We see the children grow and adapt here at the refuge, building confidence and developing relationships. I love my role and consider it a privilege to not only to work for Lighthouse but to make a difference to the wonderful families we meet.

One thing we can do to say thank you and raise awareness of the complexities around domestic abuse is to offer you and your staff some free training.

Domestic Abuse statistics are so high that we will all, at some point, come into contact with someone who is experiencing or has experienced domestic abuse. The key objective of the training is that every participant will leave knowing how to support someone who discloses that they are or have been a victim of domestic abuse, whether that be a colleague, friend or family member.

This informative 2 hour training session will also challenge some of the myths around domestic abuse and its causes, discuss the impact of the 2021 statutory guidance that places a duty of care on Employers to safeguard employees and look at what organisations can do, now that remote working has become the new normal.
